Sixth Graders Visit Mariposa

The Colfax-Mingo sixth grade classes spent a beautiful September day conducting environmental investigations at the recently improved Mariposa Recreation Area northeast of Newton. The outdoor education opportunity was led by Jasper County naturalists, Katie Cantu and Greg Oldsen.

The students participated in many activities at Mariposa. Students took a bus tour around the outside of the park where they learned about the watershed and how farming techniques affect the water

quality in our lakes and streams. The students enjoyed a hike around Mariposa where they learned about native grasses and plants. Students collected water samples from Wolfe Lake and conducted water tests to examine the water quality at Mariposa. The students also enjoyed doing a pond netting activity. Students collected many unique creatures from the pond. Students were able to identify those creatures and learn how they are affected by the water quality at Mariposa.

This was Colfax-Mingo's first visit to Mariposa park since 2018. In 2018

the lake was drained and 155,000 cubic yards of silt was removed from the lake. Silt ponds have been added to stop silt from making its way into the lake. A boat ramp, walking trails, and a kids' playscape were also added. Today, Mariposa park is a beautiful place to visit on a field trip or with family or friends.

This was a fun and educational field trip that our 6th grade classes will be able to experience well into the future. Katie and Greg always do a great job educating our students during this fun outdoor adventure.

breaks outside as we can while the weather is still nice; especially on block days!

As October comes to a close, so does our first round of Flex Time. This time is held at the end of the day on Thursdays and Fridays. Teachers used data (ISASP, MAP, test scores, in class assignments) to make decisions on what groups students should be placed in during this time to receive extra support or en-

richment opportunities. These groups rotate about every 4-5 weeks and are broken up by an "Advisory Week" so teachers can create new groups based on new student data. The goal is to provide students with "in the moment" instruction to support what is currently happening in the classroom.

As we get further into the school year, please encourage your student to be an active participant in their education. Whether that means communicating with teachers when they need extra support, double checking notes with a friend, asking clarifying questions, or participating in class to further understanding. We are all here with the same goal of student success, but

it takes everyone rowing the boat to cross the finish line. Self-advocating is an amazing trait to have, but it also takes practice! This is a great time to hone that skill.

Parent-Teacher conferences will also be held in November. For the Junior/ Senior High School, we will hold conferences from 4:00-8:00pm on November 11th and 16th. We will have an open house format with teachers set up in the cafeteria and media center for families to visit and discuss celebrations and opportunities for growth.
