### FFA News — Kenny Schlosser

Kenny Schlosser has been selected as an Iowa State FFA Star finalist in the area of Agriculture production. Kenny will be recognized on April 12th at Hilton Coliseum. He is receiving this award based on his supervised agriculture experience, record book, degree application and FFA involvement over the past 4 years. Kenny's SAE consists of cow calf ownership, feeder cattle ownership, and working with various areas of livestock and raising crops at Schlosser farms. Kenny has been involved in over 21 activities the last 4 years. Kenny will be interviewed Tuesday afternoon for judges to make final selection. There are 5 other FFA members that he will compete against that are also finalists State Star. There are over 17000 FFA members in the state of Iowa. There will be over 5000 members and guests present at state convention. The only other 3 members to be recognized for this award in the 73 year chapter history are Calvin Schlosser, Brent Magg and Brad Magg. Kenny's parent is Mollie Schlosser who will also be on stage with Kenny.



## History of April Fools' Day



April Fools' Day spread throughout Britain during the 18th century. In Scotland, the tradition became a two-day event, starting with "hunting the gowk," in which people were sent on phony errands (gowk is a word for cuckoo bird, a symbol for fool) and followed by Tailie Day, which involved pranks played on people's derrieres, such as pinning fake tails or "kick me" signs on them.

In modern times, people have gone to great lengths to create elaborate April Fools' Day hoaxes. Newspapers, radio and TV stations and websites have participated in the April 1 tradition of reporting outrageous fictional claims that have fooled their audiences.

In 1957, the BBC reported that Swiss farmers were experiencing a record spaghetti crop and showed footage of people harvesting noodles from trees. In 1985, Sports Illustrated writer George Plimpton tricked many readers when he ran a made-up article about a rookie pitcher named Sidd Finch who could throw a fastball over 168 miles per hour.

In 1996, Taco Bell, the fast-food restaurant chain, duped people when it announced it had agreed to purchase Philadelphia's Liberty Bell and intended to rename it the Taco Liberty Bell. In 1998, after Burger King advertised a "Left-Handed Whopper," scores of clueless customers requested the fake sandwich. Google notoriously hosts an annual April Fools' Day prank that has included everything from "telepathic search" to the ability to play Pac Man on Google Maps.
