As we enter December, there are plenty of celebrations to be had so far this school year! We met our first building

goal of increasing the percentage of students who made adequate growth on their MAP tests this fall by 10%. We went from 44% to 54%! We will be taking the MAP tests again in January, and

our goal is to reach 64% of our students making adequate growth. The tests cover the subjects of reading, math, and science and provide teachers with more in-depth information regarding students' understanding of specific skills.

Another building goal for this school year is to decrease our number of students chronically absent (missing more than 10% of the year) from 38% to 20%. We are currently at 31% of students having missed at least 10% of

the school year so far (about 7 days). There is still time to get this number down, however! You can easily check your student's attendance through Infinite Campus. We also have students creating attendance goals during advisory and tracking progress on those goals each month.

The end of first semester will be here before we know it. As that approaches, please encourage your student to be checking their grades, staying on top of any missing work, and communicating with their teachers for any extra support or questions. We will also be updating schedules for the second semester, so now would be the time for your student to reach out to a counselor with any change requests for the second semester.

Thank you for your continued support throughout this year. We appreciate our Tigerhawk family now more than ever. Let's make the rest of the year a great one!
