I'm very excited about our initial Community Resource Night that the district will be hosting on January 26th from 5:00-7:00 pm at the Colfax Historical Society building. In addition to a free dinner, our attendees will have the opportunity to connect with local, county and state resources that provide a variety of services. This includes: counseling, addiction services, educational materials, connections to food services and much more. Our goal with this event is to help our families con-

nect with the wide variety of services that are available, most of them at no cost. It also allows our community and the school district work together to strengthen our communication and provided needed support.

We will also begin working on preparing for the next school year and assessing where we are currently as a district. This includes preparing the schedule for next year, having our SIAC committee continue working on providing input on issues such as bullying and harassment, and establishing our staffing plan for next year.

We are extremely excited with our full day Preschool program that we are piloting this spring, with the intention of expanding it next year to additional classrooms. We are also in the initial planning stages for before and after school care at our elementary building. We will be sending our further infor-

mation and seeking feedback from the community to determine the need.

We are also seeing the end in sight for our construction projects at the High School. Phase 2 (arena) is on schedule to open late March/early April as well as the track surface being installed in March. This will allow our track programs the ability to not only practice on a high quality surface, but also host track meets this spring. Our plans for graduation include hosting it in the new arena. The new arena includes an indoor track and wellness center. Information about public access to those areas will be coming in the near future.

Welcome to the new year and the 2023 portion of the school year. The first five months of the school year have gone by quickly. I would expect nothing different from the remaining five months.

January is a time to refresh and reset. Staff will begin the new year by reviewing our SOAR building-wide expectations and classroom routines and procedures. SOAR stands for S-show self-control, O- offer kindness, A-act responsibly, and R- respect everyone and

everything. The building will also continue to talk about our building theme: Ride The Wave To Success. There have been many successes with the first part of the year that include assessment data, the elementary's High Performing rating on the Iowa School Performance Profile, and our social emotional data. The social emotional data includes our school counselors *Minute Meetings*, Conditions for Learning data and our behavior data collected by staff.

As we begin January, the elementary will continue to focus on The Science of Reading during the late

start of professional development time. January is also the second window for our FAST assessments. This includes fluency, vocabulary, comprehension and math. The data collected is used during our weekly Collaborative Learning Time at each grade level. The data is also used at the building level to review instructional practices and strategies. The building has implemented a building-wide intervention time for all grade levels at 9:30 three days a week. I've been working with a second grade fluency group and it is one of my favorite times of the day.

Student Leadership Team (SLT)

This group of leaders has been busy these last few months. These leaders were chosen by their peers and staff. They had to deliver a speech to their grade level peers and any staff that were available to listen. They were provided an outline to guide them through their speech and an opportunity to show their leadership skills and express themselves as well through that interaction. They are also responsible for their actions in and out of the classroom. They reflect upon themselves weekly among one another and rate themselves accordingly. They created their rubric and guidelines and adhere to them accordingly.

In addition to the above, they also are responsible for a monthly "community service project", daily announcements, community meetings, school wide incentives, SOAR Store and so much more! We thank them for their leadership and dedication to making Colfax-Mingo the envy of rural communities.

The K-2 students still have the store brought to them by the 6th grade SLT students. The 3-6th graders get to shop online using our PBIS Rewards online program.
