ISASP Testing

We will administer the Iowa State Assessment of Student Progress (ISASP) tests this spring during the week of April 17 for grades 7-11 and during the week of April 24 for grades 3-6. Students are tested in the areas of reading, language, writing, and math. Grades 5.8, and 10 also test in science. These assessments are required by the Iowa Department of Education, and the scores factor strongly in how schools are rated across the state through Iowa School Performance Profiles. Additionally, we use the scores from these assessments to support educational decisions, so it is critical that we have accurate data.

Parents and families can support the school by emphasizing the importance of students taking the testing seriously and putting forth their best effort. The tests are not timed. Iowa Testing Programs suggest scheduling approximately one hour for each test, but stu-

dents can take as long as they need to finish. Research has shown that students who take advantage of the full time score significantly higher than those who do not.

Parents and families can also help out by ensuring that their children get plenty of rest during the week of testing. In addition, making sure that students are present and on time to school during the week of testing helps minimize the amount of make-up tests that have to be scheduled. We thank all of our students, families, and staff members for working together to ensure that our kids can accurately demonstrate their learning and growth from year to year through these assessments. Radon testing results

Those items included the following: 1. Install a cover over the sump pump pit in the boiler room, and seal around it with silicone. 2. Identify any holes in the basement walls, and fill those with insulation. 3. Make sure all floor drains have water in them. 4. Fill in any cracks in the foundation with silicone. 5. Fill in any gaps around plumbing and electrical conduit that are coming into the building through the foundation walls or floors. 6. Replace HVAC filters. Once those items were complete, we then did the second test, only in the areas that were elevated. On March 20th, we received the results of the second test. The district

office is now below E.P.A. radon gas standards. Unfortunately, three rooms at the elementary are still elevated above E.P.A. standards. Those rooms are the gym, the preschool room on the stage, and the new teacher workroom in the basement. We are currently working on getting bids by a licensed radon mitigator to install a radon mitigation system. It is still safe for students, staff, and community members to use these spaces. In compliance with the state of Iowa, this work will be completed on or by June 30th, 2023. If you have any further questions, please feel free to email me at bcooper@colfaxmingo.org.

The test results came back with three rooms at the elementary site. and the office area at Central office having elevated radon levels above the E.P.A standards. I worked alongside the Energy Association of Iowa Schools to come up with a list of corrective measures before a second (required) test was done.

As April approaches, so does assessment time at the elementary. Grades 3-6 will take ISASP testing the week of April 25th. Students will take assessments in english language arts, writing and math. 5th grade students will also have a science test. The FAST window for grades K-6 also opens the week of April 25th. These assessments will include fluency, a Reading and a Math. The data collected from these assessments will be used by staff to make instructional decisions for the building. The data also will be used by

teachers to review the growth of students.

We are in the final trimester of the school year which means one more time to review our SOAR expectations.

The matrix is used to give examples of how students show SOAR around the school. It includes the bus, classroom, lunchroom, playground, hallway, restroom and assembly. The example below includes Show Self-Control. There are additional categories for Offer Kindness, Act Responsibly, and Respect Everyone and Everything.
