Attendance at the elementary is off to a great start! Let's keep that positive momentum going. The average daily attendance rate is currently at 96.5%. Our goal is to keep it above 95% for the year. This is the time of the year that we see more absences across the building. Please make attending school a priority and communicate when your student is absent.

Did you know?

• Starting in preschool and kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.

• Missing 10%, or about 2 days each month over the course of a school year, can make it harder to learn to read.

• Students can still fall behind if they miss just one or two days every few weeks.

• Being late to school may lead to poor attendance.

• Absences and tardiness can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up.

The Colfax-Mingo sixth grade classes spent a beautiful September day conducting environmental investigations at Mariposa County Park northeast of Newton. The outdoor education opportunity was led by Jasper County naturalists, Katie Cantu and Greg Oldsen. Students participated in many activities at Mariposa that aligned with the lowa Core science standards - Earth and Human Activity and Engineering Designs. Students learned about the Mariposa watershed and how it affects the water quality in our lakes and streams. The students enjoyed a hike around Mariposa where they learned about native grasses and plants. Students collected water samples from the lake and conducted water tests to determine the water quality at Mariposa. The students also enjoyed doing a pond netting activity in which many unique creatures were collected from the lake. Students were able to identify those creatures and learn how they are affected by the water quality at Mariposa.


